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# From The Co-Principals

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We are delighted to inform you that this year we are celebrating record breaking examination success at GCSE! The Collingwood Class of 2015 achieved the College's best ever set of GCSE results! This is all the more pleasing as there continues to be an increase in rigour within exam papers and students need to gain more marks to secure top grades.

- 72.5% or 235 students achieved 5 or more A\*-C grades including English and Maths which was an increase of 6% on 2014
- 83% or 269 students achieved 5 or more A\*-C grades which was an increase of 3% on 2014
- 26.5% or 86 students achieved 5 or more A\*/A grades including English and Maths which was an increase of 5.5% on 2014
- 30% of all GCSE grades (from 987 entries) were at A\*/A which was a 4% increase on 2014
- 46 students achieved 10 or more A\*/A grades
- 6 students (all girls) achieved 14 or more A\*/A grades
- 78% achieved an A\*-C grade in Maths which was an increase of 3% on 2014
- 80% achieved an A\*-C in English which was an increase of 5% on 2014
- 84% achieved an A\*-C in 2 Sciences which is an increase of 4% on 2014
- 26% achieved an A\*-C in 3 Sciences which is an increase of 8% on 2014

As parents you will know this represents an incredible amount of hard work and commitment from our students and we are all extremely proud of their achievements.

At A level, AS level and BTEC, results continue to be outstanding with 53% of all A level grades awarded at A\*-B which was an increase of 3% in 2014. All the students who wanted a university place were successful.

The students who took exams at the end of Year 10 also achieved record breaking success. 27 students from a class of 31 achieved an A\* in GCSE Maths and our GCSE short course RS results were 10% up on the previous year at 64% A\*-C.

The students who took a one year course in Year 9 were rewarded with some excellent results too. In French and Drama the A\*-C pass rate was an amazing 98% and Spanish achieved 68%. The GCSE Citizenship students achieved 60%. As a consequence more than 70% of the current Year 10 cohort already have a qualification graded C or better and we know that even more will be able to build on this success in the future.

At Collingwood we are committed to developing responsible, aspirational, independent, happy and well-rounded young people but the curriculum must ensure that all students are able to follow a suitable range of courses so they can enjoy exam success. In 2015 97.5% of students achieved at least 1 A\*-C grade.

2016 will bring new challenges with new performance measures for schools. However, we are driven by our desire to ensure that students leave Collingwood with the appropriate qualifications to access their chose career path and the personal skills to make a valuable contribution to society. For this reason we will continue to maintain a strong focus on maximising the number of students who can pass 5 good GCSE subjects, including English and Maths.
