
Progression


Why study Art, Craft & Design?

- It is a very valuable subject to study if you:
- Enjoy being creative.
- You have a keen enthusiasm for art and love painting and drawing.
- Want to learn more about different artist styles and how they can develop your own art style.

Am I suitable for the A Level course?

Yes, if you have:

- Minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grade 9-4 (or equivalent) including Grade 5 in Art or Photography. (Grade 4 may be considered)
- An aptitude for and an interest in art.
- Possible career aspirations that are linked to
 - art/media/fashion/advertising/architecture/interior design/stylist etc.
- A creative love and independent learning skills.



What is the course structure?

The A Level course is 100% practical, it is made up of 2 components:

Coursework 60% - A personal investigation chosen by you based on a theme or style of art which you like. In year 12 you will start the course by experimenting and exploring possible ideas which will enable you to confidently complete this extended project. You will be inspired by appropriate artists and create several final outcomes. You will develop your artist skills from GCSE/BTEC and become a far more independent, creative artist.

In year 13 you will also be required to write a 1-3000 word essay which is based on your theme.



What will I learn on the course?

You will:

- Develop your ability to respond to and appreciate the visual world.
- Develop your creative and technical skills using a very broad array of media
- Learn how to employ analytic, creative, presentation and problem solving skills in order to communicate visual ideas and meanings.
- Gain knowledge of artists and experience of developing ideas with the context of Western and non-Western cultures.
- Be inspired by others to create your own responses in a creative way.
- How is the course assessed?

You will receive continued verbal and written feedback throughout the course. On completion your work is internally assessed and externally moderated.
