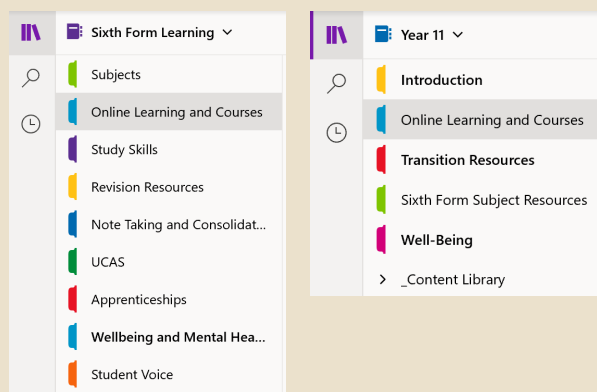

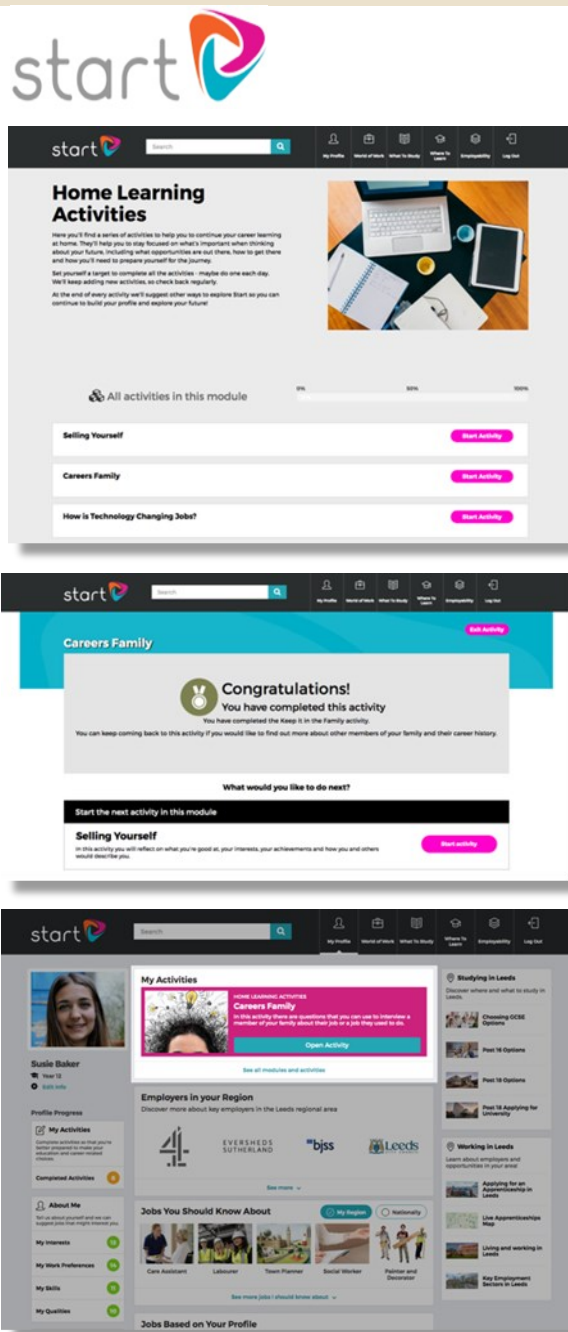
Step 3: Complete an Activity
