






PARENT GOVERNOR BALLOT - REMINDER TO CAST YOUR VOTE!

LEAVERS' CATERING ACCOUNT BALANCES

All funds paid into students' catering accounts via ParentPay are paid directly to our catering company and not the College. At the end of term they will begin processing refunds of surplus balances. If a student has a sibling here at Collingwood, the balance will be transferred into their account (unless requested otherwise) or a refund will be made to the paying parent.

EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.



If you need to meet with a teacher, staff member or College leadership, please contact the College office to schedule an appointment.

3-day Response to Parental Communications

We would also like to remind you that we have a **72-hour response** period for staff to reply to parental communications. It is obviously unreasonable to expect immediate responses to emails or messages when staff have full teaching and meeting commitments. This protocol also allows us time to investigate your communication and to reply with a detailed response to you. In all cases, we would ask parents to use the **tc@collingwood.surrey.sch.uk** email address to ensure communication is directed to the correct member of staff and to ensure an appropriate reply is made within 72 hours.

SUCCESS STORIES

Adam tells us about his experience of dyslexia and working at the National Trust. After joining the Trust last year, and then recently successfully applying for the role of Countryside Manager, he reveals the adjustments that were made to the interview process and talks about how he's recently been inspired by an apprentice on his team.

I recently joined the National Trust and in common with 10% of the population I am dyslexic but didn't have this confirmed until my late 30's.

If 10% of the population are dyslexic (with many not knowing) it means the National Trust has 750 dyslexic employees, 500,000 dyslexic members and 2.7 million dyslexic visitors.

The generic role profiles are already in an accessible format, I was given interview questions written down, had plenty of time for interview exercises. This resulted in all candidates being assessed to our best and in a way that was relevant to the role.




