## ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

## **Armed Forces Families & Safeguarding**

## 2023 Service Pupil Premium

### Extra Funding to support Service children.

The Department for Education (DfE) provides additional funding (£335 per pupil) for state schools, academies and free schools to support Service children in England.

The Service Pupil Premium (SPP) exists to provide mainly pastoral support in recognition of the challenges these children may face. It is for the school to decide how the money is spent and can be used for individual pupils or added to larger support projects, with children from Reception to Year 11 attracting the funding.

Service parents are encouraged to inform schools of their Service status ahead of the Autumn school census deadline of 5th October 2023. Without this information schools will miss out on this additional funding.

The information recorded by schools regarding Service status is protected and data regarding individual children is not shared outside the school.

Pupils attract SPP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces (including pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the Full-Time Reserve Service)
- One of their parents died whilst serving in the armed forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme
- They have been registered as a 'Service child' on a school census in the past six years under the DfE's Ever 6 Service child measure
- One of their parents is in the armed forces of another nation and is stationed in England
