

## **STEVE BARKER – Community Governor and Chair of the Governing Board**

Steve has been a Governor at Collingwood since 2000 and is also Chair of the Governing Board at Bagshot Infant School and a Member of the EEEA Multi-Academy Trust. Steve lives with his wife, who is a teacher, in Bagshot and all four of their sons attended Collingwood.

Steve began his career in marketing and advertising, working in a variety of roles with Boots, Gillette, Proctor and Gamble and Henkel. He combined his career in marketing with voluntary work as a Governor and through this became involved in Governor training and development and also served as an Ofsted inspector.
